

You should be aware that this is a wilderness area. There are, among other things, wild beasts native to this area. Among them mountain lions, bobcats, coyotes, deer, raccoon, spiders, flies, ticks, ants, mosquitoes, and mice. These animals are wild and **must be left alone**. Some of the smaller animals (raccoon and mice) can get into tents, packs, clothes, food bags, etc. Keep all food and items with a scent stored appropriately so as not to attract these animals.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. FIRE REGULATIONS

- No liquid fuels of any kind.
- NO WOOD OR GROUND FIRES!
- Charcoal ONLY In Containers For Dutch oven Cooking
- The Scout Camp is a No Smoking Facility

2. WHAT TO BRING

- Water Containers Water spigots are near all camping areas.
- Trash Bags Please make sure that *make arrangements to* take ALL TRASH home with you. There are no trash facilities at the camp for campers.
- Tables Only a few sites have tables. You may bring your own.
- Chairs There are no chairs in the campsites or at the campfire ring.

3. WATER and TRASH DISPOSAL

- Please secure ALL trash in vehicles during the weekend and then TAKE IT WITH YOU when you go home. Remember! There is wildlife everywhere that would like to help themselves.

4. KYBOS

- Please use them for their intended use ONLY!
- Those identified for Ladies only are for Ladies ONLY.

5. VEHICLES and PARKING

- Parking will be allowed in designated areas **ONLY**.
- All vehicles entering the Camporee will be given a Parking Pass.
- All vehicles MUST be backed-in when parking.

6. SECURITY

- Security will be provided by the Order of the Arrow Staff. If there are any problems or concerns, let them know or bring it to the attention of the Camporee Committee Staff.

7. LOCAL TOUR PERMIT

- A Local Tour Permit MUST be filed for your unit PRIOR to your travel to the Camporee. You must show your Tour Permit at Check-In.

Campfire - Your Troop will need to have a Skit or Song for the Campfire on Saturday night. Each Skit/Song will be for reviewed on Saturday at 1:30 PM by a Youth member of the OA.



Camp Inspections & Gadgets & Gateways

Campsite Inspections will take place on Saturday morning. Included in the Campsite Inspection will be a category for a Camp Gadget. Camp Gadgets and Gateways are pioneering projects that use lashings and knots - and most importantly Be Useful and Used!

Dutch Oven Cook-off



If your unit would like to participate in the Dutch Oven Cook-off during dinner on Saturday night, you need to sign-up when you check-in. The judging categories will be: Vegetable; Meat; One-Pot Dish; Dessert; and Other (for

those items that don't fit in the other categories). Dishes should be brought to the Staff area Saturday night at 5:30.

All charcoal MUST be in containers and off the ground!

FIRE AND EMERGENCY ALARMS

All campers are instructed to immediately stop what they are doing and to walk quickly to the paved road and find their units. Leaders will take a head count and inform the Camporee Staff

2008 FALL CAMPOREE INFORMATION

- 1. All Scouts and Leaders are expected to wear their Field Uniforms on Saturday.
- All areas outside the established Camporee boundaries are <u>OFF LIMITS</u> for all Scouts and Leaders. This means DO NOT leave the campground that you are camping in or where the activities are taking place during this Camporee.
- 3. Please follow the signs to the Check-In area and campsites.
- 4. All participants must be registered Scouts or Scouters.

CHECK-IN INFORMATION

At Check-In, several things will take place.

You will provide:

- 1. Camporee Unit Registration Form Remember this information is used to issue patches. (Only the number of people listed on the form and paid will be issued patches.)
- 2. Your **Tour Permit** and **Guide to Safe Scouting**.
- 3. Please coordinate with everyone associated with your unit, including Webelos Dens that may be participating with Troops, when traveling to the Camporee.

We will provide:

- 1. Parking Passes for the Camporee one for each vehicle. Any vehicle not displaying a Pass will be questioned. We want to make this a safe activity by being able to identify those who do not belong there.
- 2. Campsite assignment and list of activities with a map.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Campsites will be assigned according to the paid registration. Each unit is responsible for providing their own tents and lights.

Participants are expected to obey the *Scout Oath* and *Law*. Scouts will be allowed to demonstrate their leadership skills. Misconduct and/or unsportsmanlike-like conduct may be cause for asking a Scout and/or unit to leave the Camporee.

A Scout is Trustworthy. A Scout's honor is to be trusted. Scouts attending the Camporee are encouraged to have a good time, but at all times all attendees are expected to set a good example and to put their best foot forward.

We encourage everyone to leave those electronic gadgets, etc., at home. If any of these devices are a distraction, they may become the property of the Camporee Staff until the Camporee is closed.

Two-Deep Leadership is required by National directive. Please ensure that you have a minimum of two leaders (one adult must be over 21) with your unit. Leaders *must* camp with their units. Webelos units *must* have one-on-one leadership at all times.

First Aid needs for minor injuries are the responsibility of the unit. Any serious injuries must be brought to the attention of the Camporee Staff. Medical Personnel will be available. *Ensure your unit has a Medical Release Form and Parental/Legal Guardian Permission release for all participants in your unit.*
