

The Sinoquipe Scout Reservation, better known as Camp Sinoquipe, is a beautiful 500 acre rustic Boy Scout camping facility operated by the Mason-Dixon Council, BSA. Hidden amongst the mountainous terrain of Fulton County, Pennsylvania since 1948, the camp's focal point is a 10-acre lake located in a rural area two miles from the village of Fort Littleton, just minutes from the Pennsylvania Turnpike.

The camp features 14 campsites, each with running water, washstand and latrine, and vary in size to accommodate 16 to 60 campers on tent platforms. The new Technology Center, the waterfront, shooting ranges, Ecology Lodge, Scout craft area, handicraft area, and high and low COPE (Challenging Outdoor Personal Experience) course with a climbing and rappelling tower, provide Scouts with everything they need to earn some of the over 60 merit badges offered at Camp Sinoquipe during the summer months. A modern air-conditioned Mike Callas Memorial Dining Hall, new camp showers, and a well-stocked Trading Post, located in the newly constructed Edward and Pauline Anderson Administration Building (pictured below) along with the Health Lodge, a Leaders' Lounge with wi-fi and Administrative offices, makes for a comfortable Scouting experience.

LAKUSIN - FIRST YEAR CAMPER PROGRAM

Lakusin translated means "to climb higher." This program is designed to take the First Year Camper experience to the next level. Lakusin is designed for new Scouts and those attending a summer camp for the first time. Participants in the program will be separated into patrols lead by a staff member serving in a Troop Guide-like role. Scouts will be given two options to choose from, which will focus on rank advancement. Lakusin participants can either focus on Tenderfoot/Second Class requirements or Second Class/First Class requirements. Rank skills will focus on seven core groups: Scout Spirit, Camping and Hiking, First Aid, Handicraft, Nature, Totin' Chip / Firem'n Chit and Rope Work.



SINOQUIPE MOUNTAIN MAN — A HIGH-ADVENTURE PROGRAM —

Scouts, 14 and older, can hone their survival skills while living in primitive shelters at a camp outpost for an entire week. They'll learn the trades of American mountain men throughout the eras. The program offers opportunities to fulfill requirements for various lifestyle-based merit badges.

NYLT — JULY 26 TO JULY 31 —

The National Youth Leadership Training is a six day outdoor leadership experience for current and future leaders selected by a Unit's leadership to attend. This course

offers youth leadership skills in addition

to those offered through Troop Leadership Training. NYLT replaced Junior Leader Training (JLT), and is designed in close coordination with Wood Badge for the 21st Century. This course utilizes the Boy Scout Troop structure using the patrol method. Patrol leadership changes daily to give all Scouts and Venturers a chance to experience leading as Patrol Leader or Assistant. The participants will write their own Vision Statement in which they will plan how to use their newly acquired skills in their home Troops and Crews.

CAMP AKLEA - CUB SCOUT RESIDENT CAMP

Cub Scout Resident Camp is a three-night summer camp program for graduating Tiger, Wolf, and Bear Scouts and Webelos Scouts (boys entering 4th or 5th grade) offered at Camp Sinoquipe. A two leader to seven Cub Scout ratio is required.

Please register as a Unit for camp. This will ensure that your Scouts and Leaders are camped together! Parents should make camp payments to their unit leaders; Unit Leaders are typically responsible for registering the boys for camp.

Cub Scout Resident Camp will give new Cub Scouts an opportunity to have fun and earn some advancement. Activities include swimming, nature, shooting sports, games, and more. Cub Scout Resident Camp provides Cub Scouts an opportunity to begin to learn outdoor living skills in a fun and safe environment.
