## **Shooting Instructor Class Forming**

If you take your shooting as seriously as you take your scouting, WE WANT YOU.

The Great Southwest Council Shooting Sports Committee is looking for scouters in all the districts who are serious about shooting safety and education. If your scouts do not finish their shooting merit badge at camp, it can be difficult to complete. At the GSWC SS Committee we are on a mission to get more NRA certified instructors to help each district to have stronger shooting sports programs and meet BSA national standards. In addition to local merit badge completion, we want to be able to staff some shooting weekends at Gorham for special events like Order of the Arrow shooting, Powder Horn, Venture (pistol) and district merit badge completion. BSA National requires that to run any live Boy Scout shooting activity\* there must be an RSO (certified Range Safety Officer) in control of the range and a certified instructor working with the scouts (must be instructor certified with the gun being used: rifle, shotgun, muzzle loader, pistol).

If the person that I have described above is you, WE NEED YOU. We are in the process of setting up an instructor class at the lowest possible cost.

\*Cub Scout BB gun and Archery Range Master have different BSA certifications.

### Scouts Help With Landfill Project

Last April, four scouts from Troop 535 assisted the Montezuma County Landfill during its spring electronic waste event. The scouts were Kacee Daves, Killian Kaiser, Kyle Kuhn and Brandon McMillan. They were accompanied by Assistant Scoutmaster Eddie Kaiser (who also pitched in to help for about an hour in the packaging of the electronics) and troop committee member Sara Kuhn.

The scouts helped from 8 am to 1 pm by greeting customers, completing surveys, directing traffic, unloading electronics, and packing the electronics into appropriate boxes. They also were given a quick safety briefing and wore personal protective equipment such as hard hats and safety vests.

Several compliments were received from the folks turning in their electronics, including one lady who wished she ran into more professionals who would behave like the scout who helped her with a nononsense approach tempered with incredibly good manners. Others spoke highly of the assistance and thought it was wonderful to see young men helping folks.

All the electronics collected were disposed with an E-Steward, R2 and ISO 14001 certified vendor, Natural Evolutions, in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

The county employees fed the scouts pizza for lunch, which they ate in shifts in order to continue helping the public. The landfill staff also praised the boys for their help and commented that they could not have finished packaging the 14 plus tons of electronics without the assistance and hard work of the boys.

As an aside: The boys decided to help out because the landfill foreman, Tim Bates, who is one of their active assistant scoutmasters, was taking a Wilderness First Aid course. This caused a shortage of staffing at the landfill. Not saying that Four Scouts = One Foreman, but they did help a lot and it made it possible for Tim to take the first aid class. As the landfill manager, I personally appreciated their efforts and saw a lot of leadership potential and some hope for the future in these four boys. They also had some fun!
