

CAMP PROPERTIES

Camp Pupukea - Nestled high in the Koolau Mountains, Camp Pupukea is a 65 acre Scout camp. Camp Pupukea offers central dining, a pool, shooting sports range, and eleven Troop campsites with conveniently located showers.

Camp Honokaia - Camp Honokaia, is located between Honokaa and Waimea above the Waipio Valley, known as the "Valley of Kings" on the Big Island of Hawaii. Located on 210 acres of dense wood and heavy plant growth, Camp Honokaia exposes Scouts to the opportunity to camp in a tropical rain forest and participate in ecology-conservation programs featuring many of Hawaii's endangered species

Camp Alan Faye - Located in the cool, high mountains of Kokee State Park (2,400 ft elevation) on the island of Kauai, adjacent to the famous Waimea Canyon, the 'Grand Canyon of the Pacific'. Camp Alan Faye provides six campsites with water and a central shower facility.

Camp Ehrhorn - Located on Tantalus, high above Makiki, Camp Ehrhorn sits on seven acres of property. Camp Ehrhorn can fit 39 people comfortably and has short trails about 1-3 miles that can be used for hiking.
