National Order of the Arrow Conference 2015

The National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) is the premier event of the Order of the Arrow, and is Scouting's second-largest national event. Over 10,000 Arrowmen from across our nation gather for an inspirational and unforgettable experience full of fellowship, training, adventure, and fun! This NOAC will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Order of the Arrow.

Kon Wapos Lodge is currently taking \$100 deposits to reserve your spot for the conference. The conference fee is \$500 plus travel expenses (see below). A payment plan is available and will be announced in June 2014. If you already made a \$50 deposit, only \$50 more is required to hold your spot.

The lodge has just passed the total prices for NOAC 2015 including registration and round trip transportation [leaving Sunday Aug 2 and returning Saturday Aug 9] on a coach bus.
