May 9-11, 2014

The Northeast Region, Area 3, Venturing Officers Association invites all Venturing Scouts, Sea Scouts, and their guests to attend the annual Area 3 Venturing EVENT. The 2014 EVENT weekend will be held on Friday, May 9 through Sunday, May 11, 2014, at Camp Gorton, Dundee, NY, located on Waneta Lake. Participants may attend the EVENT as members of a Council VOA coordinated contingent or with their Crew or Ship.

The purpose of the Area **EVENT** weekend is to bring Ventures together to share ideas, and encourage relationships that will promote the growth of Venturing. The Area 3 **EVENT** has been designed by the AVOA to emphasize FUN, FRIENDSHIP, and ADVENTURE, not award requirements or advancement. Participants will have the opportunity to sample a variety of activities and may find some they wish to incorporate into their Crew program. You will meet potential consultants and establish contacts that may help your Crew in their pursuits. Our goal is that the only regret you have would be that the weekend ended too soon!

The Area event begins with a big party on Friday night (that includes food, music, and opportunities to begin making new friends) and culminates on Sunday morning with the annual Area 3 meeting and induction of officers. The theme for this year is "Hillbilly Hoolenany", featuring many wild outdoor activities. We are working on a lot of great new additions that will be shared during the coming weeks. We also have some awesome training opportunities, discussion forums and an advisors coffee house.

The fee for the **EVENT** is \$45 per person (for tent camping in personal tents you bring). The fee covers all food, program, **EVENT** patch, and T-shirt, facilities and program materials. The fee applies to all youth and adults. Please note the deadlines and details on the registration form! On-time registrations must be postmarked by Friday, April 11, 2014.

Participants must bring tents and personal camping gear. Meals will be served in the dining hall and include Friday night snack, 3 Saturday meals and snack, and Sunday breakfast. Please contact us with any questions about food, camping accommodations or special needs.

Please wear the Venturing Field uniform for meetings, breakfast, and dinner. We encourage the wear of your Crew's activities uniform for all other events.

### **EVENT** Registration Participation FAQ

For Questions not addressed - please email us at area3@nerventuring-bsa.org

- 1 Can Venturing Scouts from outside Area 3 attend the eVENT?
  - ▲ Yes, please attend! ALL Venturers are welcome and encouraged to join us for the weekend. You will have a great time!
- 2 Our council does not have a Venturing Officers Association (VOA or TLC) and/or they are not organizing a contingent can we still attend?
  - A Yes. Venturing Crews or Sea Scout Ships may register and attend.
- 3 Can we bring guests who are younger than Venturing Age?
  - A No. This event is designed to appeal to young adults. The target audience is the high school and college age- group. Please do not bring anyone who does not meet the Venturing joining requirements.
- 4 Can a Boy Scout Troop or Venture Patrol register and attend?
  - A No. Boy Scouts may only attend as members, or guests of their council VOA/TLC, or a Crew.
- 5 Nobody I know is going may I attend by myself?
  - A No (and Maybe Yes) Please email us. We will try to help you find a solution. We cannot accommodate youth members who are not accompanied by an adult advisor, but may be able to connect you with a crew that is attending.
- 6 We are having trouble getting adult leaders, but our crew wants to attend?
  - A We can work with you to help overcome this problem by helping you connect with another crew, usually from your own council. Please email us ASAP.
- 7 We do not have camping gear or tents, but this event sounds like fun....
  - A The **EVENT** is for all Venturers, not just outdoor-based crews. Camp Gorton has a limited number of cabins. Contact the Five Rivers Council Service Center at 607-796-0699 for availability and price. Food is served in the dining hall, so no worries about cooking or other camp chores.
- 8 Cabins can we reserve a cabin just for our crew?
  - A There are a few cabins which can be reserved on a first-come-first-served basis. Contact the Five Rivers Council service center at 607-732-9047 or the Scout Shop at 607-796-0699 on availability and cost.

- 9 Registration Deadline Our Venturers have a hard time meeting deadlines. Why so early?
  - A In order to keep the event fee as low as possible we need to know how many are attending before ordering the patches, t-shirts (on-time deadline) and food (final deadline) and other supplies. We will not have extra food, so please do not show up without advance registration
- 10 We have participants with special needs (fill in the blank) can they attend?
  - A If you have special needs please email us ASAP we will do our best to accommodate them.
- 11 This seems like a fun event to introduce people to Venturing Can we bring guests teens who we hope to recruit into our crew?
  - A Only bring people who will behave in a mature, responsible, manner, and who identify with the ideals of the Scouting movement and goals of this Area Venturing EVENT. Please remember that, as a contingent leader or Crew Advisor, you are accountable for the behavior of your Crew during the event and adherence to BSA and event rules. The EVENT event MUST be a safe (haven) place for all participants. Be careful to bring recruits who you know and can be accountable for. Please email us if you need clarification or further discussion.
- 12 May Girl Scouts or Girl Scout Troops who are not dual-registered as Ventures in a Venturing Crews, attend the EVENT?
  - A We welcome their participation, as guests of their local VOA contingent, or a local Venturing Crew. Please contact us if you need help establishing contact with a local sponsor we would love to have you attend. Your Scouts will have a great time!!!

#### Directions to Camp Gorton

#### From Bath, New York and West

Take Rt. 17, (I-86) East. Take Exit 38. Follow the signs for Rt. 54 North, through Bath, toward Hammondsport. Continue on Rt. 54 North through the traffic light past the Hammondsport turn-off. Bear right onto Rt. 87 and climb the hill. Follow the signs toward Watkins Glen and turn right onto Rt. 96. Rt. 96 becomes Rt. 23 at the county line. Follow Rt. 23; a steep down, then up, and then down again. Waneta Lake will be on your left. Approx. 0.5 miles past the boat launch, turn left onto Rt. 25, Waneta Lake Rd. Camp Gorton entrance is 1.5 miles on the left.

#### From Corning Area

Take Rt. 17, (I-86) West. Take Exit 40, at Savona. Turn right at exit and follow Rt. 226 North to Tyrone. You will turn left onto Rt. 23 into Tyrone. Tyrone Post Office is on your right once you are on Rt. 23. Follow Rt. 23 through the villages of Tyrone and Weston. Once past Weston, speed limit resumes to 55mph. Don't speed up, as you'll soon turn right onto Rt. 25. Turn right onto Rt. 25, Waneta Lake Rd. Camp Gorton entrance is 1.5 miles on your left.

#### From Elmira Area

Take Rt. 14 North into Watkins Glen. In the village of Watkins Glen, you'll pass some Schuyler County buildings on your right, then the Post Office on your right, then Learn Motors Dodge dealership on your right. Turn left onto Rt. 409 at the traffic light just past Learn Motors. You'll only be on Rt. 409 for about 1mile. Turn right onto Rt. 28 and Rt. 23 toward Tyrone. The two routes run together for a few miles. Bear left onto Rt. 23, to Tyrone, when they separate. At the intersection of Rt. 226 there's a stop sign. Jog right then jog left back onto Rt. 23. Follow Rt. 23 through the villages of Tyrone and Weston. Once past Weston, speed limit resumes to 55 mph. Don't speed up, as you'll soon turn right onto Rt. 25. Turn right onto Rt. 25, Waneta Lake Rd. Camp Gorton entrance is 1.5 miles on your left.

#### From N.Y.S. Thruway (I-90)

Take Exit 42, Geneva. Take Rt. 14 South through Geneva and continue on Rt. 14 towards Watkins Glen. Turn right onto Rt. 54 South near Dresden. Dresden is about half way between Geneva and Watkins Glen. Follow Rt. 54 through the Village of Penn Yan. Rt. 54 snakes through the village, but is well marked. Don't be confused by Rt. 54A. Stay on Rt. 54 South, approximately 14 miles south of Penn Yan. Turn left onto Rt. 230. Follow Rt. 230 through the village of Wayne, approximately 2 miles. Rt. 230 leaves Wayne on a descending grade. Turn right onto Rt. 25, Waneta Lake Rd. Camp Gorton is 2 miles on your right.
