<u>The BSA National Public Lands Day Program</u> requires participation in NPLD Event and can be purchased through local scout shop.

<u>The NPS Scout Ranger Program</u> requires 5hrs service/education for the Certificate and 10 hrs service/education for the Emblem. The program includes time spent at *any* national park service learning about their program as well as performing some service. Scouts are encouraged to visit other local National Parks as part of the Ranger Program.
