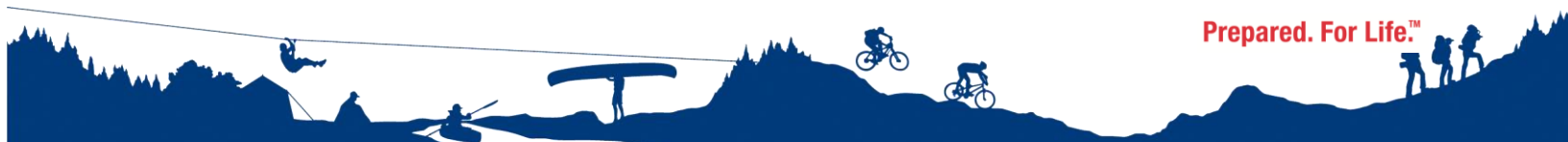

## Cub Scout Basic Training: Webelos Leader

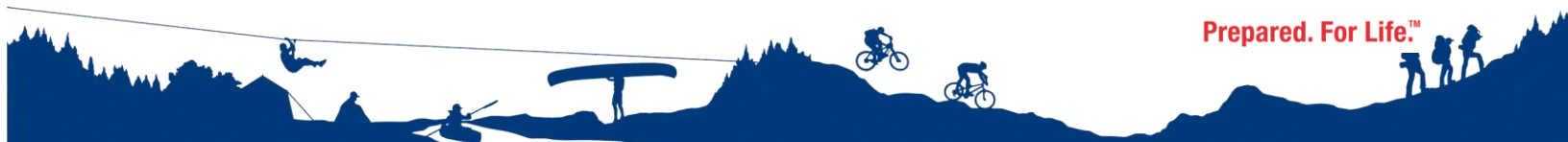

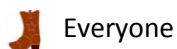
### **Shooting Sports**

### Troop/Units Boards of Review

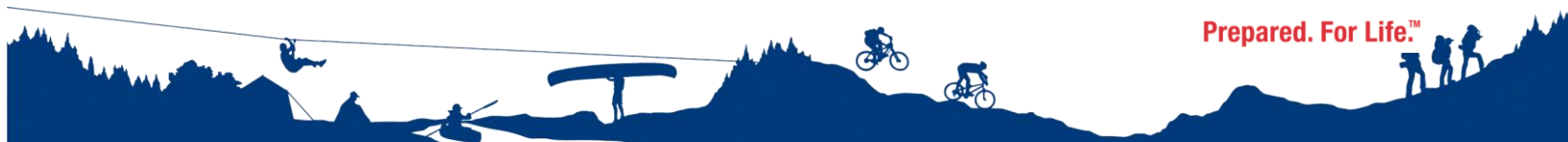
