What will be required of me as a participant?

Other Information

- All participants must present a completed BSA Annual Medical Form # 34605 (Parts A,B & C) upon arrival.
- Registration is available to all qualified Scouters, course size is limited. You will be notified of your status once participants are selected by the committee in mid-January/early Feb. 2014
- You may submit your full registration fee at this time, or submit a deposit and pay the balance prior to the beginning of the course.
- To qualify for the "Early Bird" discounted fee, <u>all</u> registration fees must be received in the Northwest Georgia Council Service Center <u>by February 5 with no balance due</u>.

- Wood Badge participants are expected to set a proper Scouting example by wearing their complete BSA Field Uniform while at Wood Badge.
