When: Saturday, April 6 and Sunday, April 14, 8:30



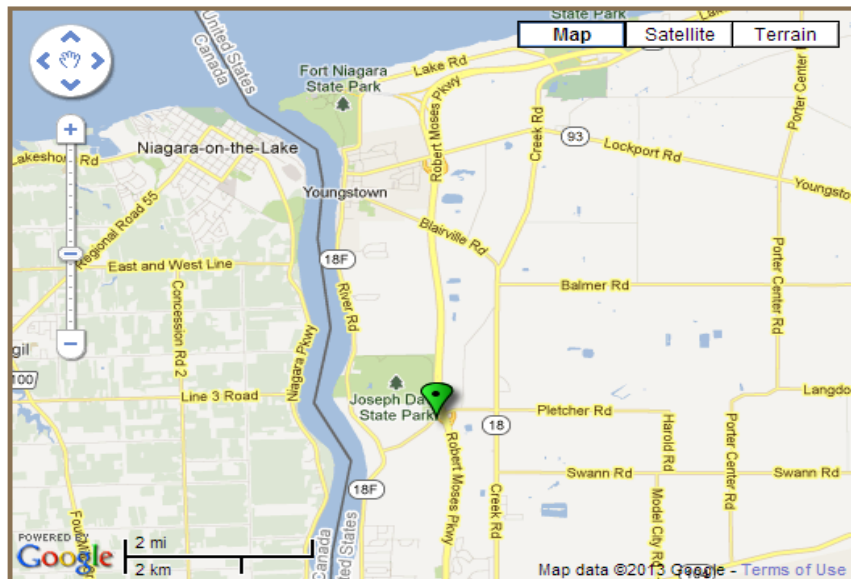
This is a great opportunity to put in service hours, give back to a community, and spend some time in a beautiful park. GNFC Scouts will be teaming up with scouts from Iroquois Trails Council on a project led by the Buffalo Audubon Society to plant “live stakes”. Volunteers will be collecting and planting 1400 willow branches in order to restore native habitat at the park.

The live stake collection will take place on Saturday, April 6, and the planting will take place 8 days later on Sunday, April 14th. Wear boots, and clothing that can get dirty.

We will meet at 8:30 AM on both days, gathering in the large upper parking lot, by where the old pool facility is. Lunch will not be provided, but families or units who wish to picnic in the park are welcome to bring one. Please wear boots, as the park is very wet, and plan to get a little dirty.
